William Thomas Bell, III (Tom) 1.2.4.1.1 was born in Washington, DC March 16, 1942 right before his father left to serve in WWII. Tom survived an attack of polio when he was 8 and went on to become a champion bowler as an adolescent and young adult. He lived and traveled with his family as an Army brat until he moved to Pennsylvania at age 18. The Philadelphia area became his true home.

Tom worked in the food service industry for 50 years where he won numerous Employee Appreciation Awards. After his retirement, he became a hospital volunteer for 18 years. He was honored at his celebration of life by Executives from Einstein Medical Center Montgomery. They acknowledged a deep appreciation for Tom's dedication, productivity and caring as a volunteer. He was described as someone who tried to make the world a better place through service to others. For his part, Tom felt fulfilled by and was passionate about his work at the hospital.

Tom never met a stranger and made friends with everyone. He was loved and appreciated for his keen powers of observation and sense of humor. He enjoyed road trips, watching fireworks and had a special place in his heart for all small dogs. He was 76 when he died unexpectedly December 23, 2018 as the result of a fall.
